1.	<b>Welcome and Apologies</b> Apologies as per above list	
2.	<b>Notes of the Previous Meeting</b> These were agreed as an accurate record.	
3.	<b>Current Awareness</b> The group discussed their various methods of providing current awareness services. Various examples were given including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Bradford District Care Trust – explained about their database of 800+ users which covers 60 areas of interest - collated via a 'Feedly'. This is very quick and easy tailored to the individual. Exports into excel, word or outlook. This enables the information to be timely and very specific to the Trust.</li> <li>Cumbria – have just purchased Knowledge Share which can be tailored; people register their interest in current awareness and appears to be quite flexible, covers conditions.</li> <li>Others use Kings Fund Bulletins, TOC alerts and tag these.</li> </ul>	
4.	<b>E-Resources: new developments</b> The group had a discussion about new e-resources and also about registering statistics and usage. For example some services create skeleton records on their library management system for users, even if they only use electronic resources. A general discussion ensued. The resources discussed included BrowZine, EBSCO Discovery and Clinical Skills.	
5	<b>Mental Health Librarians – future meetings/ways of working</b> YHNE library group explained what had been agreed at the last meeting which was 1 in YHNE, 1 Mental Health Extra and 2 via Teleconferencing. NorthWest explained they at the moment have 4 meetings a year however the group was smaller in number and they would await the new Chairperson and allow the status quo to prevail at this time.  NorthWest TOR was updated in 2016.	

	The group were requested to think of a theme for the joint meeting in 2018.	
6	<p><b>Updates from all</b></p> <p><b>Cumbria</b> The update from Cumbria discussed how the STP in the area would be working and that there would be some movement over the coming months.</p> <p><b>Lancashire Care NHS</b> Stated that the library extension received a funding bid which had a grand opening has been renamed and a small comfy area has been created.</p> <p><b>GMMH</b> – merger has taken place, still working toward joining Heritage (library catalogue). More service users using the service. Two sites but 1 library service which covers a large area.</p> <p><b>BDCFT</b> – Have trialled EBSCO Discovery and BrowZine awaiting the Heritage App. In preparation for this had to check the notes field of members records. Planning an Evidence Based Conference with 150 delegates venue to be Bradford City Football Ground. CQC were visiting.</p> <p><b>SWYT</b> Launched Health Information Services in Health Information Week. Trying to operate little and often see what can be done to keep afloat. Based on volunteers lounge which has its own network, one morning a week. Fuller services to be developed. Have changed Directorate and new structure. Providing knowledge management and hope to start knowledge cafes.</p> <p><b>Doncaster Bassetlaw</b> Built up relationship with RDASH supporting services were can.</p> <p><b>Hull and East Yorkshire Hospitals NHS Trust</b> Working on their relationship and waiting to see how the change in contract affects.</p> <p><b>Cheshire and Wirral Partnership NHS Foundation Trust</b> Moved site and structure has changed, studying on the KfH Leadership programme awaiting time.</p>
