Evidence to inform a postnatal improvement plan

NHS Nottingham and Nottinghamshire CCGs approached library and knowledge specialists for assistance in obtaining a synthesis of evidence to support the development of a local Postnatal Improvement Plan.

Library and knowledge specialists undertook a rapid review and developed evidence packs to inform workshop discussions. This saved the organisation an estimated £6,500 which would have been needed to procure this support externally.

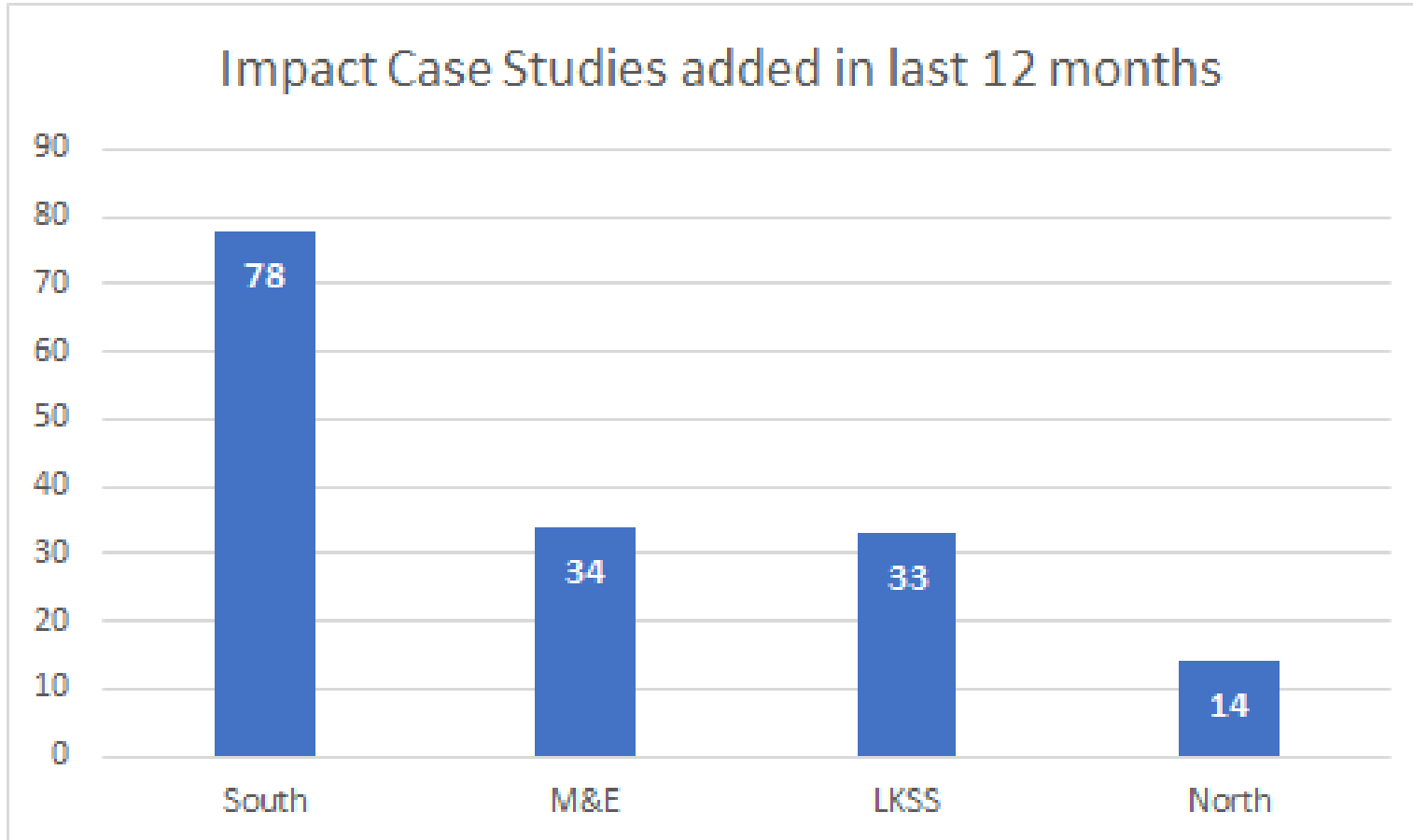
