#### HEALTH AND WELLBEING

Support for Health and Wellbeing sits at the heart of our library offer

Libraries provide residents with access to independent, trusted sources of information, support for health literacy and to a wide range of programmes of activity to support wellbeing

#### LEEDS LIBRARIES

Our unique selling point is a "cradle to grave" free offer:

- Free space to meet and collaborate
- Free resources such as books, magazines, business databases and digital resources
- Free support from a knowledgeable staff team providing information and guidance on a range of topics like:
  - How to get online
  - Booking an appointment with a GP



### LEEDS LIBRARIES

Libraries are free, welcoming and accessible spaces at the heart of the community. Across Leeds we have 34 libraries, 7 mobile libraries and 4 outreach sites, including at Kirkgate Market

300,000 Leeds residents hold a library card and we offer a cradle to grave service - everything from Bounce and Rhyme for babies to reminiscence sessions for older people and we welcome residents from all sections of the community

Libraries are natural bumping spaces, places where children and families, young people, students, and people from different background can meet, share the space and share the resources







### **STORY BUS**

At the heart of Ready Steady Readers are two new Story Buses which can take the Early Years offer to all areas of the city, including those not close to a library

Providing non-clinical spaces for delivering health activity such as maternity services






